

The 2012 Board and Key staff were presented with certificates thanking them for their volunteer contributions to the EGL Region. After dinner, we began the highlight of the evening by sharing video of each city's guest speaker with attendees in all 3 cities.

Bob Brinkman (Woolpert) started the guest presentations by giving an insightful and picture filled slide show of the history of the

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2013 ASPRS Conference – Baltimore, MD March 24-28

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The ASPRS Annual Conference was held in Baltimore, MD on March 24 to 28, 2013 at the Baltimore Marriott Waterfront Hotel. Throughout the five days the EGLR had 4 current board members and 4 past board members in attendance. With proximity to our region, the Board saw and talked with many EGLR members who had the opportunity to attend and/or present technical sessions this year.

The first two days of the conference were reserved for ASPRS committee meetings, workshops and vendor user group meetings. The committee meetings are an opportunity for anyone within ASPRS to attend and listen to others to gain insight to ASPRS internal business activities. The committee meetings are also a great opportunity to get involved at the national level and participate in interesting conversations as ASPRS continues to move forward through the 21st century.

On the first day, Dr. Charles Toth, Karen Carter and Jim Peters attended the Region Directors Meeting. We heard from other regions on their activities. The EGLR was spotlighted by Roberta Lenczowski (ASPRS 2012 President) about our successful use of GoToMeeting Video at our Winter Meeting to share guest speakers between Pittsburgh,

Columbus, and Ann Arbor. Roberta noted that this was a novel idea to communicate with region members across geographic expanses. Jim was asked at the end of the meeting to develop a webinar to help the other 16 regions learn the logistics of planning a multi-city meeting event. Other committee meetings we attended included ASPRS Films, Membership, New Board Orientation, and Electronic Communications. An insightful addition this year was the opening of the New Board Orientation to Regional Board members. In the past this meeting was only attended by National Board members and ASPRS Bethesda Staff. It was a great opportunity to gain knowledge in region reporting responsibilities to the national office.

Despite some of the technical sessions being cancelled due to the government sequestration, Technical Sessions held on Tuesday through Thursday were still well attended by conference attendees. A highlight of EGLR members presenting this year began on Monday with Dr. Charles Toth (Center for Mapping, The Ohio State University) co-presenting a ½ day workshop [LiDAR Waveform: The Potential and Benefits for Topographic Mapping]. On Tuesday Lisa Erickson (Photo Science, Ann Arbor, MI) was moderator/presenter for a Change Detection topic and Dean Merchant (Professor Emeritus, Ohio State) led a "Hot Topic" session titled, "ASPRS Aerial Camera Calibration Guidelines". Wednesday brought Dr. Charles Olson's (MTRI, Ann Arbor, MI) with his "Is Accuracy Necessary" presentation. Later that day, EGLR members, Dr. James Lein (Ohio University), Dave Dean (MTRI) and Colin Brooks (MTRI) held simultaneous presentations ranging in topics from Hyperspectral Assessment of Fire Hazard within the Wildland Urban Interface (Lein) to Identification of Unpaved Roads in a Regional Road Network using Remote Sensing (Dean) to Characterization of Unpaved Road Conditions Through the Use of a UAV Helicopter (Brooks).

The EGLR's 3-city web-shared meeting concept was highlighted several more times throughout the week by Roberta Lenczowski including at her outgoing President's speech on Tuesday at the Annual Awards Luncheon and again during an awards presentation on Wednesday. The EGLR was honored to receive the Region Website of the Year Award.

A majority of attendees on Wednesday March 27th had the opportunity to see James R. Irons, PhD (NASA Goddard Space Flight Center) discuss the Landsat Data Continuity Mission (LDCM). We were shown a video of the separation of the satellite in sub-orbit. The first image from LDCM was taken over the front range of the Rockies. When LDCM reaches its final orbit location, its name will change to LANDSAT-8. May 31, 2013 is when LANDSAT-8 imagery will be available on-line. Following the LDCM presentation was the Presidential Address by the incoming 2013-14 ASPRS President, Stephen DeGloria, PhD (Cornell University). Stephen is also the ASPRS Re-Organization Task Force Chairperson (see Task Force article on page 5 in this newsletter).

ASPRS Restructuring Task Force: Update

The purpose of the ASPRS Restructuring Task Force (RTF) was to examine our current national and regional organizational structure and to generate specific recommendations and action items for consideration by the ASPRS Board of Directors (BOD) that sustainably advance the mission of ASPRS for the benefit of all members and the imaging and geospatial information community at large. The RTF was an outgrowth of the Rebranding Task Force (2011) in which a number of issues, or action items, were defined and subsequently melded into the charges of the RTF. Some action items continue under the auspices of the Rebranding Task Force and some action items have been assumed by relevant standing committees.

The goals of the RTF were focused on: (1) strengthening the relevancy our professional society; (2) improving governance nationally and regionally; and (3) providing more learning, networking, and mentoring opportunities. These goals can be achieved by delivering technical programs that implement the objectives of our strategic plan, increasing focus on region-based technical programs, promoting student and young professional engagement and leadership, and strengthening the impact of our peerreviewed publications.

Specific restructuring issues addressed by the RTF included: (1) the philosophical basis, vision, and value proposition of ASPRS that can be articulated to the geospatial community and used as guidance for governance entities within our organization; (2) improvement of national and region officer training and governance; (3) modification of our organizational structure that encourages locally-based technical programming, virtual thematic affiliations of members within and between regions, and de-emphasis of physical geography and firm boundary conditions; (4) re-organization of our conferences and technical meetings that recognizes more diverse imaging and geospatial needs of our membership and audience locally and nationally; (5) enhancement of publication policies relevant to our PE&RS journal and general interest articles and columns; and (6) improvement of learning, networking, and mentoring opportunities for student, associate, and young professional members.

Several recommendations for each major issues defined above were presented for consideration by

the ASPRS Board of Directors during our annual conference in Baltimore during last March. Members of the Board have until May 1 to respond with their respective views on how best to move forward with these recommendations. Decisions with respect to these recommendations will be posted in a future issue of PE&RS.

The project involved sock donations from conference attendees and an entertaining competition among the 17 ASPRS Regions; all focused on giving back to the local Baltimore community, while providing a seemingly simple necessity, socks.

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EGLR receives several awards 2013 ASPRS Conference Baltimore, MD

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Dr. Carolyn Merry (The Ohio State University Center for Mapping) was one of eight who for 2013 received an ASPRS Presidential Citation Award. The award was first established in 1992 for the recognition of special, personal, and meritorious contributions to the operation or advancement of the Society and its interests during the presidential year. Roberta Lenczowski (ASPRS President 2012) presented the award to Carolyn for her sustained volunteer representation of ASPRS on the National Academy of Sciences Mapping Science Committee and at the University Consortium for Geographic Information Science Meetings.

Jeff Lovin (Woolpert) along with 9 other members of the Guidelines for Procurement of Commercial Geospatial Mapping Products Committee each received the ASPRS Outstanding Service Award. Established in 1991, it is given to society members in recognition of outstanding and unusual efforts in helping ASPRS develop and carry out its program over a sustained period by achieving ASPRS goals and objectives.

Jim Peters (BAE Systems; EGLR 2013 President) accepted for the EGLR in winning the ASPRS Regional Website of the Year Award. Jim is in the middle of a 3 year term, beginning in 2012 as website editor for the EGLR. The EGLR also won for Most Improved Website. Established in 2003, this award serves to recognize excellence among the regions in providing service to members and to the profession at large through web site publication. Judges select winning sites based on their ability to demonstrate high quality look and feel in the site design and effectively convey accurate, informative and timely content.

The American Society for Photogrammetry and Remote Sensing (ASPRS) is launching an association and conference focused smartphone app for use by ASPRS members and those interested in the Society. The app will keep ASPRS competitive and continue to provide members with the tools they find essential. The app is available for both iPhone and Android platforms.

The technology available through the smartphone app includes accessing the ASPRS mobile website, direct access to "My ASPRS" portals with editing and log-in capability, a student information tab, a publications tab for browsing the ASPRS bookstore and online publications, an upcoming webinar and events calendar and membership "Join Now" material.
